
We start each Sacred Time with the sign of the cross.



<u>Sign of the cross:</u> In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

- This prayer is calling to mind God who is the Father, Son and Spirit.
- We reminding ourselves to remember God in our thoughts, in our hearts and in the work we do.
- The actions make a cross to remind us about Jesus.
- The sign of the cross marks that this is a special time.

Day 1

Advent comes from a Latin word that means 'arrival'.

Advent is the season of preparation for the arrival of a very special guest - Jesus at Christmas. It is a joyful time of hope and expectation.

How do Christians prepare for Jesus?

Day 1

It is important that Christians prepare spiritually for Jesus and prepare their lives for his arrival.

Day 2 - Hope

An Advent wreath helps us to count down the 4 Sundays to Christmas. A candle is lit every Sunday at church. There is a white candle in the center that is lit on Christmas day.

The candles and the wreath are very symbolic.





4. The fourth candle represents love. This candle reminds us that God loved the world that he sent Jesus to us.

5. Christmas day = Jesus is the light of the World



3. The third Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday, which means 'rejoice'. We are rejoicing because Jesus is nearly here. The third candle is pink.

The Circle of the wreath represents that God's love never ends.

1. Hope candle. This reminds us of the hope that Jesus brings. It is also the candle of the prophets who predicted Jesus' arrival and hoped for him.

> 2. The second candle represents peace. Jesus is known as the King of Peace.
