
We start each Sacred Time with the sign of the cross.

Day 1

Day 3 - Peace

An Advent wreath helps us to count down the 4 Sundays to Christmas. A candle is lit every Sunday at church. There is a white candle in the center that is lit on Christmas day.

The candles and the wreath are very symbolic.



4. The fourth candle represents love. This candle reminds us that God loved the world that he sent Jesus to us.

5. Christmas day = Jesus is the light of the World



3. The third Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday, which means 'rejoice'. We are rejoicing because Jesus is nearly here. The third candle is pink.

The Circle of the wreath represents that God's love never ends.

1. Hope candle. This reminds us of the hope that Jesus brings. It is also the candle of the prophets who predicted Jesus' arrival and hoped for him.

2. The second candle represents peace. Jesus is known as the King of Peace.

Day 3 - Peace

This week's candle is for peace.

What does peace mean to you? Is there peace in the world? How can we help to create peace?

Dear Lord,

Your Son is known as the Prince of Peace.

Help to find peace in our own lives, and to bring it to others.

Give world leaders courage to make bold choices and to bring peace to countries suffering because of war and conflict.

Amen.
