Well done to these, and all of our students who do exceptional things every day!



What is DofE?

DofE is a brilliant way for young people to discover just how much they are capable of. It gives young people the chance to make new friends, follow their passions, learn new skills and make a difference in our community.

Achieving a DofE Award is a great way to impress employers too. It also helps young people to see themselves differently and gain a new level of confidence.

To achieve their Bronze Award, your young person will need to complete four sections – Volunteering, Physical, Skills and the

Expedition. Young people can choose what they would like to do for the first three sections, and we will provide all the guidance and support they need. The

Expedition involves spending two days and one night in the countryside. We

provide comprehensive training beforehand to ensure everyone is fully

prepared and has the best possible experience.

The cost for this year is £75. £30 is the registration fee for the young person's DofE pack. £45 is the cost for the Expedition (including 1 training day at the campsite, the expedition costs and costs for the Expedition Assessor)

The cost part is optional in terms of including. A letter will be going out first week back with all the details.

What to do next?

1. Yr11 students need to be updating their edofe accounts with evidence and activity logs for their Physical, Skill and Voluntary sections, ready to be assessed.

2. First week back on Wednesday 6th November there will be a meeting with Mr Daly for any year 10 students interested in completing their bronze awards this year. Meeting will be in M4 at 3pm.
