Listen	<p>In the Gospel reading from Mark, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech issue. Despite Jesus’ instructions to keep the miracle quiet, the news spreads widely. This story shows Jesus’ compassion and power to heal. We all suffer from spiritual deafness at times. Sometimes we don’t want to hear God’s voice or the opinions of others. Jesus can heal us, just as He healed the deaf man, if we take time to listen. To overcome our spiritual deafness, we need to spend more time in prayer. Listening to God, rather than just speaking, can open our hearts to His healing. The reading reminds us of God’s healing power, His justice, and our call to live out our faith. We are encouraged to trust in God’s promises, treat everyone with equality, and seek healing from Jesus.</p> <p>Prayer: Lord, open our ears to hear Your voice and our hearts to receive Your healing. This shocks the disciples, who struggle with the idea of a suffering Messiah. Jesus asks us to follow Him. Being a Christian and following Jesus sometimes requires us to face challenges and difficulties. Unlike the scribes, the widow does not gain any honour from her actions. No one notices her but Jesus. Her faith and trust are pure, and her sacrifice shows her deep love for God. The widow’s example challenges us. Are we willing to give all we have to God? Her story encourages us to trust in God’s care, even when it is difficult. Its origin can be traced back to Jewish tradition, as described in the Book of Exodus. In this book, it is stated that every firstborn male child belongs to God and must be consecrated to Him. This tradition was followed by Mary and Joseph, who brought Jesus to the temple to fulfil this requirement. They were fishermen, likely illiterate and not educated. Yet, Jesus saw potential in them. He calls ordinary people to be His disciples, showing that anyone willing to follow Him can be used for His purposes. The fishermen’s response is immediate. They leave everything and follow Jesus. This act of leaving behind their livelihood and security demonstrates their trust and commitment. It teaches us that following Jesus often requires sacrifice and a willingness to let go of our own plans. Our call to follow Jesus is similar. We might feel unqualified or unworthy, but Jesus invites us to trust Him and follow Him wholeheartedly.
