

Baptism is a <u>sacrament</u> that most Christians usually have as a baby, but this sacrament was instituted by Jesus when he was baptized by his cousin John.




Why was John baptizing people?


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Trinity

Jesus the Son is being baptized, God the Father speaks from heaven and the Holy Spirit is represented by a dove.




Why is it important?

Why is it important?




This shows that God loves us unconditionally. He sent his son to save us, he is giving us another chance to be close to him.


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Why is Baptism important now?






